Russ Gundrum In less than 100 years, the power and telecommunications industries have become highly technological and competent in servicing the growing electrical power and communication needs of a complex, modern society. This tremendous advancement has not been without problems of mutual compatibility, however. In the early days of power and telecommunication transmission, fundamental incompatibilities existed between the two systems since both used the earth as a ground return conductor. As the length of both systems' lines grew and the number of subscribers increased, the inductive interference problems became more severe. Further expansion of both industries was seriously threatened when it became necessary to refer these problems to the courts and commissions for resolution, such as California's General Order 52 issued in 1912. As a consequence, representatives from both industries joined in cooperative efforts to study and resolve the main causes of incompatibility. This joint effort, primarily between the Edison Electric Institute and the Bell System, resulted in over fifty engineering reports during the 1920's and 30's. This cooperation resulted in numerous advances and innovations, with the primary development being paired conductors enclosed in metallic shielded cables for telecommunications transmission. Developments such as drainage reactors, longitudinal chokes, neutralizing transformers

and isolation transformers also occurred and were applied to open wire lines to suppress power line interference. The above practices and procedures were usually adequate in solving most electromagnetic and electrostatic induced voltage and current problems. However, in the 1960's and 70's certain design features and trends in the environment occurred that presented new and challenging problems in the area of incompatibility. As a result, the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE) formed the Inductive Coordination and Electrical Protection (ICEP) Committee to provide effective execution of the following considerations: 1) Design of systems to minimize inductive interference and susceptibility. 2) Adopt standards and guidelines relating to interference. 3) Establish a continuing dialog between interested parties to provide a medium for exchanging information in the advanced planning stages of new facilities. In the meantime, some manufacturers have responded to the industry's need for equipment similar to that used in the open wire days, but better designed and more economical for cable applications. Information on these devices is provided in the later chapters of this manual.

The writers covered in the individual essays represent most Spanish-speaking American nations and a variety of literary genres. Each essay provides biographical and career information, discusses the major themes in the body of work, and surveys criticism, ending with a detailed bibliography of works by the writer, works available in translation if applicable, and works about the writer. The editor's tripartite introduction freely associates themes and images with/about/for the works of Spanish American women writers; explains the history and process of the collaborative effort that this volume represents; and traces some feminist concerns that recur in the essays, providing commentary, analysis, suggestions for further research, and hypotheses to be tested. Two general essays complete the volume. The first examines the oral testimony of contemporary Indian women outside of the literary tradition, women whose words have been recorded by others. The other surveys Latina writers in the United States, an area not otherwise encompassed in the scope of this volume. Appendixes classify the writers in the main body of the work by birth date, country, and genre. Also included is a bibliography of reference works and general criticism on the Latin American woman writer, and title and subject indexes. This book addresses the needs of students, translators, and general readers, as well as scholars, by providing a general reference work in the area of Spanish American literature. As such, it belongs in the reference collections of all libraries serving scholars and students of Latin American and women's studies and literature.

Making Peace with Spain

The Diary of Whitelaw Reid, September-December, 1898

University of Texas Press Whitelaw Reid, according to H. Wayne Morgan, was a "leading newspaperman, more than an occasional diplomat, a power in his party's politics, a supporter of some of the best in his era's culture . . . Of all his legacy, perhaps the record he left of his part in the Peace of Paris is the most significant and most interesting. It not only reveals the workings of his mind and of the peace conference, but also suggests the complex currents that carried his country into the realities of world power in the twentieth century." In editing Reid's diary, Morgan used much material pertinent to the Paris Peace Conference of 1898, employed here for the first time. This material is a rich assortment of archival matter: the Reid Papers, the John Hay Papers, the John Bassett Moore Papers, and the McKinley Papers, in the Library of Congress; the Peace Commission records, in the National Archives; and unpublished materials in the Central Files of the Department of State. Whitelaw Reid, as a war correspondent during the Civil War, as clerk of the

House Military Affairs Committee, and later as a successor to Horace Greeley on the Tribune, gained access to the leaders of his times and insight into their actions. In 1889 he was appointed U.S. Minister to France by Harrison, and in 1892 he had the dubious honor of being chosen as Harrison's running mate on the losing presidential ticket. An influential friend and supporter of President McKinley and an occasional advisor to him, Reid was no stranger to politics and to international diplomacy when McKinley appointed him to the Peace Commission that wrote the treaty concluding the Spanish-American War. As a matter of fact, Reid's opinion reflected the administration's attitude of expansionism, the policy of Manifest Destiny—or "imperialism," as it was later called. Reid's diary records the details of the sessions of the Joint Peace Commission of Paris from September through a large part of December of 1898. His day-by-day entries reveal the complexity of issues to be considered, the tactics of both the Spanish and the American Commissions in attempting to gain advantage for their respective governments, the interplay of the personalities of the once-proud Spaniards and the brash Americans, the political objectives influencing the points of view of the various members, and the maneuverings that brought about the final resolution of debated issues.
